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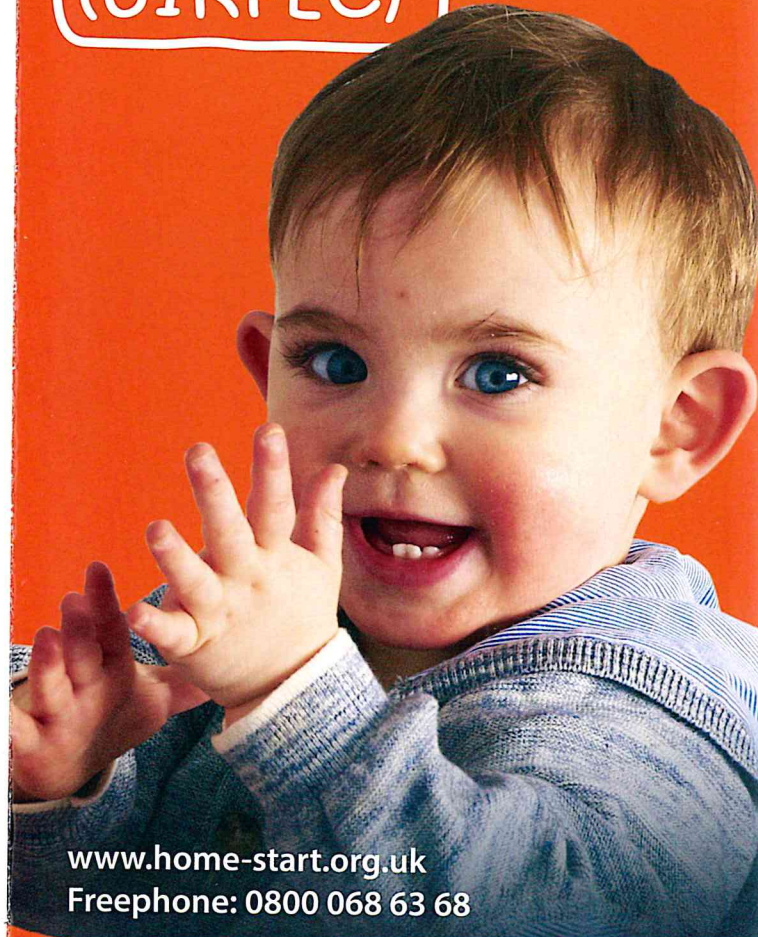

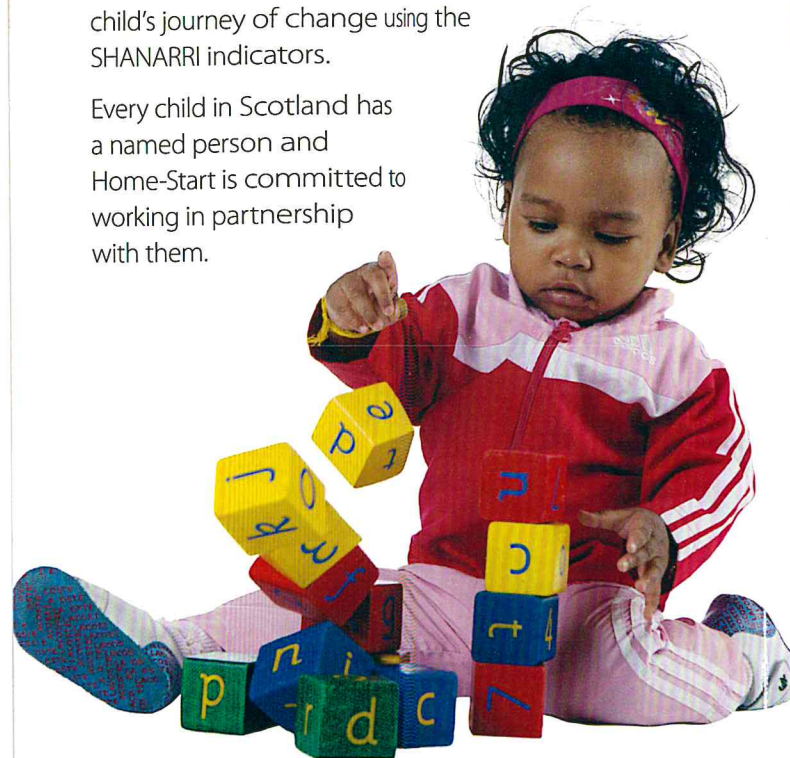
THE WELLBEING OF CHILDREN IS at the Heart of Home-Start's work

We ensure that support for every family is tailored to their individual needs.

Our experienced volunteers are trained and supported to work effectively within the GIRFEC approach.

Home-Start has a robust Monitoring and Evaluation system. This enables us to show a child's journey of change using the SHANARRI indicators.

Every child in Scotland has a named person and Home-Start is committed to working in partnership with them.



We work towards Getting It Right For Every Child (GIRFEC) by supporting parents to cope with adversity and build resilience.

Home-Start volunteers enable parents to increase their confidence and ability to meet their children's needs.

Our work in partnership with parents and other services helps them effect positive change in their children's wellbeing.

We measure that change using the SHANARRI wellbeing indicators:

Safe – Developing warm, consistent parenting in a safe environment

Healthy – Understanding their child's physical and mental health needs and the services available

Achieving – Making learning fun, understanding child development and supporting children to reach full potential

Nurtured – Providing warm and caring family relationships that promote positive attachments

Active – Creating or providing appropriate opportunities for play and recreation with their children

Respected – Listening to their children and responding appropriately

Responsible – Involving their children in roles within the home

Included – Expanding their children's social networks and utilising community services
